Official Information Act request

Thank you for your request under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA), received on 25 August 2022. You requested:

- a) Your organisation's current salary bands;
- b) Which jobs fall into which of those salary bands;
- c) If your organisation has negotiated a collective agreement that provides for new salary bands that are not yet in effect, those salary bands; and
- d) If so, which jobs will fall into which of those not yet in effect salary bands;
- e) Any policy your organisation has re the position within a band at which a new appointee to a role will typically be placed.

Response to your request

Requests (a) and (b)

The Broadcasting Standards Authority applies salary bands to the following positions (as at May 2022):

Position	Remuneration Band
Chief Executive	\$209,880 - \$256,520
Legal Manager	\$100,000 - \$148,000
Principal Legal Adviser	\$95,400 - \$121,900
Senior Legal Adviser	\$84,800 - \$116,600
Legal Adviser	\$63,600 - \$90,100
Graduate Legal Adviser	\$50,880 - \$72,000
Executive Office Manager	\$58,300 - \$84,800

These bands are reviewed from time to time and updated to reflect market data.

Requests (c) and (d)

The BSA has not negotiated such a collective agreement.

Request (e)

The Authority's policy on starting salaries is as follows:

Starting Salary

- 8.1.1 Employees will typically be positioned relative to the midpoint based on assessed competence and experience relative to the requirements of the job description.
- 8.1.2 New staff will typically start at a rate lower than the midpoint until they can demonstrate performance at 100% competence in the role. It is anticipated that junior staff may move progressively to 100% of midpoint in early years.
